
- Unified CSS Panel

CSS System Colors

Dreamweaver 8

- renders system colors in Design view
- no built-in interface available
- must be hand coded
- CSS System Colors
 - are case-sensitive
 - work in modern browsers (Windows & Mac)





Example Code: CSS System Colors

 CSS system colors can be used for any property that has a color as (part of) its value



Absolute CSS, Absolutely!

 As of Dreamweaver 8 you may now link to CSS files with absolute URLs and still have them render in Design view
 link href="http://[path]/[file].css" rel="stylesheet" type="text/css" />

Code - What's New

- Coding Toolbar with totally new functionality including:
 - Code Collapse Functionality
 - Various Comments (Add/Remove)
 - Wrap Tag
 - Recent Snippets
 - Other new functionality hidden in commented out code in toolbars.xml
- Context Menu functionality
 - Selection submenu
 - Code Hint Tools submenu
- Changes to how Code Completion works



Miscellaneous New Stuff


- Saved Workspace Layouts
- Opening Files in the Order You Want
 - Didn't cover, but tossed in slides to make it up to you!
- Re-ordering the documents
- And more...



Saved Workspace Layouts

- Save a variety of workspace layouts
- Select the saved workspace layout that fits the tasks at hand

Note: Workspace layouts only manage panels and the Document window, not toolbars.






Open Multiple Files (in the Order You Want*)

- Ctrl+click (Cmd+click) individual noncontiguous files
- Shift+click once and then a second time to select all files between and including the ones you selected using Shift+click
- * Windows only The order you select the files in is the "backwards order" that they will be opened. To get your desired order, select the files in reverse order of their final opened order.

Re-ordering Open Documents

- Click and drag the filename tabs into the order you want!
- There isn't a visual indicator that moving filename tabs can be done or any sort of transparency to indicate the same tab is being held and moved. Send your suggestions for tab re-ordering interface to http://www.macromedia.com/go/wish



No RDS, No Icons...No More!

 Dreamweaver requires that a ColdFusion MX 7 testing server with RDS access be defined in order for the new ColdFusion MX 7 objects (circled below) to appear in the CFFORM category





Editing insertbar.xml – What You Should Know

- In your User's Configuration, locate:
 Configuration\Objects\insertbar.xml
 Note: If the file does not exist, copy the Program's file to your User's Configuration.
- Casing counts, so be careful. It is best to edit insertbar.xml in HomeSite or other text editor besides Dreamweaver.
- Look for the <category> tags to help you find the section you're looking for
- Restart Dreamweaver after any changes



How to Edit the showlf Attribute

Change:

```
showIf="dw.getDocumentDOM() &&
  dw.getDocumentDOM().serverModel.getServe
  rVersion('Server.ColdFusion.ProductVersi
  on.Major') >= 7"
```

To:

```
showIf="dw.getDocumentDOM()"
```



Surround with

- New in Dreamweaver 8, Ctrl+Shift+3 will surround the current selection with # symbols
- Potential "Gotcha": HomeSite uses Ctrl+3, but this is reserved for <n3> tags
- Solution(s):
 - Adjust to the new shortcut
 - Overwrite the default shortcut with Ctrl+3
 - Add Ctrl+3 as the keyboard shortcut for Insert> ColdFusion Objects> Surround with #
 - Create a Surround with # Snippet and add the keyboard shortcut



Visual authoring with XML data

Client-side XSL transformation:

- the end user looks at an XML file but sees it nicely formatted
- requires the XML file is on your own site
- works only in modern browsers
- When using Preview in Browser on an XSL file:
 - Dreamweaver generates a flat HTML (using a Temp file)
 - the code output is HTML but filled with namespaces and other extra code
 - the output could be saved from the temp file and cleaned up manually if desired



Example: Client-Side XSL Transformation

- 1. File > New > Basic Page > XSLT (Fragment)
- 2. When the Locate XML Source dialog appears, choose "Attach a remote file on the internet" and type

 http://weblogs.macromedia.com/dev_center/index.rdf
 as the URL for the XML source.
- 3. The Bindings panel is populated with a full representation of the XML file. Drag out the title, create, description and create a link to Read the article.
- 4. In Design view, select everything that should repeat
- 5. Choose Insert > XSLT Objects > Repeat Region
- 6. Choose the rss:item node in the XPath Expression Builder (Repeat Region) dialog
- 7. Press F12 to preview



XSL Transformation with ColdFusion

ColdFusion Transformation:

- Beginning with the file from the previous demo, remove the entities from XSL file. (Entities freak out CF.)
- 2. Save the XSL file
- (See next slide for example code.) Explanation of the ColdFusion in simple terms: Read the XML file in, read the XSL in, and transform it using ColdFusion
- Preview it in the Browser
